

REWARDS AND SANCTIONS

Pluses

These should be given for a good piece of work for the boy concerned. A maximum of two pluses can be given at a time for any individual piece of work.

Pluses can be given for work, good behaviour, helpfulness or any beneficial contribution to school life.

Certificates

Certificates for accumulated pluses will be awarded in assembly as follows:

Bronze	Junior 30	Senior 25
Silver	Junior 50	Senior 40
Gold	Junior 70	Senior 55

The Senior total is set lower as, for the most part, they are harder to gain as boys move through the school.

Platinum certificates are awarded on a termly basis for the boy receiving the most pluses in Year 3/4, 5/6 and 7/8.

All-rounder cup

A cup competition for Seniors and Juniors will reward all round achievement. Points will be awarded throughout the year for participation in all areas of school life as well as for achievement. These scores will be defined before the competition begins.

Bronze and Silver certificates are awarded in the weekly House Meeting and Gold certificates are awarded in Assembly.

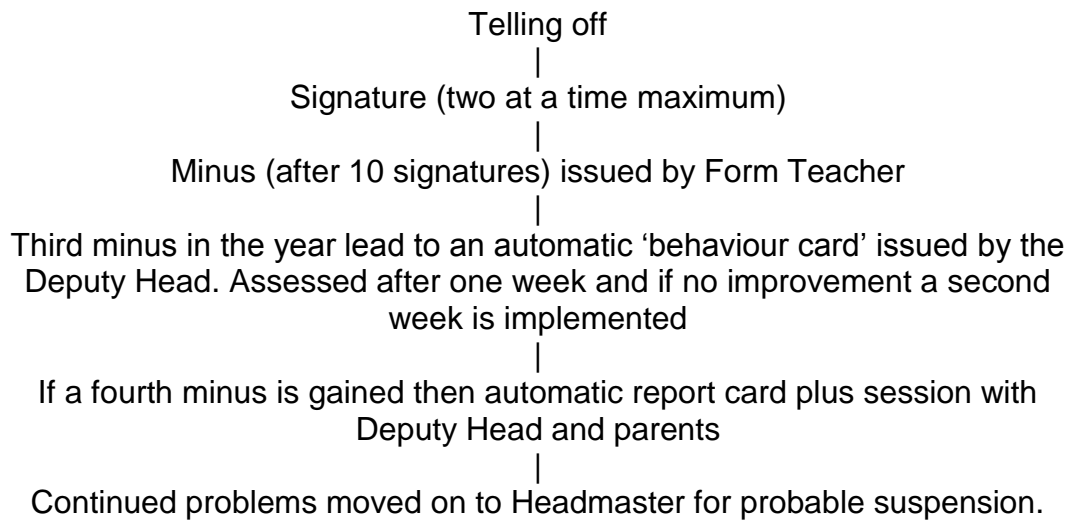
MINUSES, SIGNATURES AND DETENTION

MINUSES are given for 'serious' offences, at the discretion of the teacher.

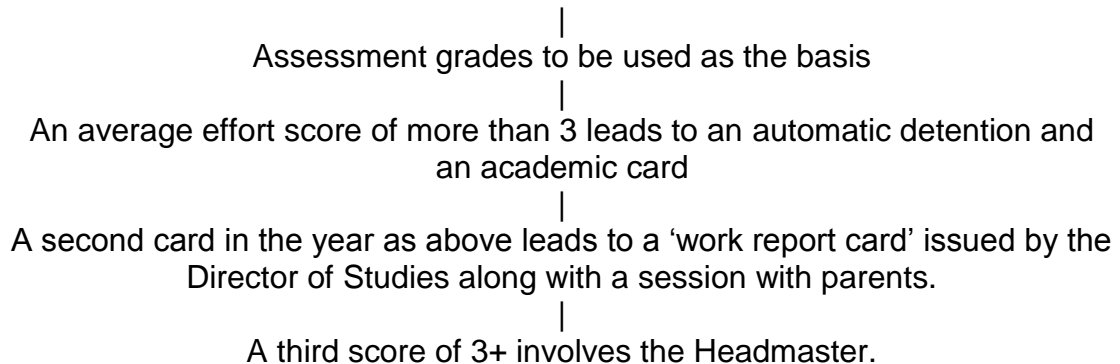
SIGNATURES allow staff flexibility in deciding on a punishment for boys who may not have committed a deed 'worthy' of a minus.

Whilst signatures are clearly useful in acting as an immediate sanction and deterrent it is important that they should not be used as a way of passing the disciplinary 'buck': boys will have greater respect for those whose discipline does not rely excessively on external measures. It is further vital that boys understand, and if necessary have explained to them, the reason for the award of a signature.
